Claudia Ward introduced **Sosamma Samuel-Burnett** who is Founder/President of G.L.O.B.A.L. Justice - an international, nonprofit organization. Our speaker was born in India, and came to the United States by way of Canada. Sosamma has more than 30 years of experience as a human rights advocate & policy professional, and about 20 years as a college professor. Sosamma's calling & passion for impacting human rights was predominantly influenced by her grandmothers & her mother.

A handout of PowerPoint slides was distributed with global data & statistics about political, economic & social status of women - identifying both historical & current trends. Currently, there is uneven progress toward women's rights; and, regions with less concern or progress for justice have less rights. Gender-based discrimination, persecution & exploitation are increased and varied depending upon vulnerabilities (3 courageous, surviving women were profiled).

Some interesting stats shared about Women in the World:

- 3.95+ billion women live in this world (out of a 7.8+ billion people living on the planet).
- More than 50% of the women live in Asia; the least amount of women are located in the United Arab Emirates.
- In the United States, more women reside on the East Coast.

G.L.O.B.A.L. Justice hosts about 150 events/year at their offices @ Micah Place (342 E. 3rd St., in the historic Hahn Haus built in 1893). GLBL MRKT, their artisan store partnering with organizations serving vulnerable populations through survivor-made goods, is located inside.

March is Women's History Month in America, and March 8th is International Women's Day. This month a number of activities are scheduled @ Micah Place, and *Women in Power* is an annual event. Also, G.L.O.B.A.L. Justice supports & partners with other organizations (such as Alternatives To Violence in Loveland). On Thursday, 3/28 @ 5:30 pm there will be a Community Conversation with the Loveland Police Department & BILPOC community (Black, Indigenous, Latinx, People of Color) @ Micah Place - sponsored by G.L.O.B.A.L. Justice & Heart and Sol.

Learn, Lead, Do Justice. Sosamma also shared the importance of mentoring in both directions - to mentor <u>and</u> to be mentored. This closing quote was offered: "Women should study history, and make it." - Malala Yousafzai
